



20 Years of Feminist Activism and Social Change

The CURE Foundation (CURE) is a feminist-activist organisation committed to gender equality and positive social change through educational, artistic and cultural, and research-based programmes. By organising affirmative actions, CURE celebrates the strength and power of women and works to empower individuals to become drivers of positive social transformation in Bosnia and Herzegovina and beyond. Feminist activism has enabled the creation of a **safe space** where women are strong, fearless, capable, and united in all their diversity. CURE is an organisation that blends professionalism with activism – its team members take to the streets in public protest against violence, discrimination, breaches of the law, and fundamental human rights violations. They organise performances against all forms of violence and call on artists, scholars, educators, activists, and citizens to act and contribute personally to building a better and healthier Bosnian and Herzegovinian society.

Over the past two decades, **CURE has become** a recognised centre of feminist activism in Bosnia and Herzegovina and the wider region. Through various initiatives and programmes, we have **empowered thousands of women and girls**, raised dozens of key issues related to social justice, initiated public debates, and continuously created safe spaces for dialogue and social change. We are a driving force in strengthening and educating the women's movement in Bosnia and Herzegovina and the region, and **we are widely recognised** for our strong advocacy for women's rights, the empowerment of socially marginalised groups, women active in politics, and the creation of safe spaces for activism and socially engaged art. Our work is rooted in feminist, anti-militarist, and anti-fascist principles and beliefs, and our engagement includes initiatives that contribute to the physical, economic, and social security of women.

Through our **interactive programmes**, **workshops and public debates**, we empower women and girls to recognise their rights and become agents of change. We also explore opportunities for improved legal frameworks that will ensure greater protection of women from violence, fairer economic conditions,

We place particular emphasis on supporting marginalised groups of women, including LBT* women, women with disabilities, single mothers, women from rural areas, survivors of violence, Roma women, migrant women, women who have survived various forms of cancer, and those who are invisible and forgotten.

In the challenging geopolitical context we face – where women's rights are under threat and the space for activist engagement is shrinking – we continue to act as a bridge between local and regional feminist peace initiatives. We believe that solidarity is essential for strengthening the women's movement, and we actively work to build networks and partnerships with feminists, activists, and organisations across the region and the world.

We are committed to creating and preserving feminist knowledge and culture, cultivating spaces where the voices of women and marginalised groups are heard and mutually empowered. Our response to gender-based violence is **immediate and decisive** – we act swiftly when help, support or concrete solutions are needed. By organising protests and public actions, we raise our voices against injustice, inspire and gather activists to join us in the collective struggle for equality, dignity and a society where justice is real and accessible to all.



Direct Actions in Public Spaces

Through **70 diverse and creative actions** carried out on the streets of Sarajevo and other cities across Bosnia and Herzegovina, including the collection of signatures for numerous petitions, we have drawn public attention to key issues such as gender equality, violence against women, the rights of LGBTIQ+ persons, and social justice.

With recognisable symbols and banners, our street actions have not only raised awareness but also inspired the public to reflect and act. We have brought important – but often overlooked – questions to the forefront, expressed solidarity with women in war-affected areas, and amplified the voices of those who are otherwise unheard.

Public Responses and Social Responsibility

Public responses and social responsibility form the foundation of our activist engagement with the broader public. Through more than **200 public state-ments and over 3,500 posts on social media**, we call for accountability, denounce violence and injustice, and advocate for positive social change. Our responses are a strong expression of solidarity and support.

In this spirit, we speak on behalf of all those who are marginalised, oppressed, and excluded from social processes, because we believe that the rights of every individual and collective cannot be achieved without broader solidarity. **Providing support is our duty** – to be a voice, but also a call for collective action and shared responsibility in building a more just society.





BARARCH FOR JUSTICE AND EQUALITY

International Women's Day – 8th March – is a day to celebrate women's economic, political, and civil rights, as well as their contributions to society. Through its commemoration, we strive to uphold the legacy of historic resistance against all those who stand in the way of achieving women's rights and peace.

In order to preserve the memory of the origins of the women's movement and to draw public attention to the issues of gender inequality and the everyday struggles of women in Bosnia and Herzegovina, we traditionally organise and lead the March on 8th March in Sarajevo. Every year, we invite representatives of marginalised groups, workers, pupils, students, elderly women, representatives of institutions, academia, the media, and all citizens who share the desire for a state of equal rights to join us in the streets – to, once again, demonstrate resistance to injustice and express our determination to stop all forms of oppression against women and marginalised communities.

Our street actions marking 8th March have gathered more than 3,000 people over the years. We have marched for the rights of working women, against femicide, for reproductive rights, against domestic violence and sexual harassment, as well as against warfare and the militarisation of society, which disproportionately affect women. We have brought attention to burning global issues by connecting the struggle of women in Bosnia and Herzegovina with the broader feminist struggle worldwide, emphasising the importance of peace, security, and women's rights in both wartime and post-conflict contexts.





Education and Empowerment

Through **550 unique workshops**, we have provided knowledge and tools to women and young people to help them recognise their rights, develop critical thinking, and actively participate in social processes. Our feminist values are embedded in the methodology and approach to the topics we have addressed:

- Gender equality and feminism
- Economic empowerment of women
- Political participation of women
- Violence prevention
- · Self-care and integrated safety
- Art and activism
- Dealing with the past and building peace.

Public Debates and Conferences

We have organised **150 public debates** that brought socially taboo topics into the spotlight. By gathering experts, activists, journalists and institutional representatives, we have initiated dialogue on often neglected issues, creating space for critical analysis and problem-solving.

In addition, through **20 local and regional conferences**, we have created opportunities for exchanging knowledge, experiences, and fostering joint action among feminist initiatives across the region. These events have strengthened networking and solidarity among activists and organisations advocating for women's rights, the rights of marginalised groups, LBTIQ+ people, and social justice.

Contribution to the Feminist Community

More than **55,000 women, girls and allies** have participated in the activities of the CURE Foundation, contributing through their engagement to the strengthening of the feminist movement in Bosnia and Herzegovina and beyond. Our headquarters in Sarajevo has welcomed over 1,200 individuals seeking information, support, advice, and inspiration for their own activism and work within local communities.

Spreading the Feminist Vision

Year after year, our initiatives contribute to **breaking down prejudices**, **stere-otypes and social taboos**, **while also raising awareness** of crucial societal issues that directly affect women and gender justice. We continue to build a **feminist future** through informal education, advocacy and direct action, firmly believing that change comes when we raise our voices **together for justice and equality**.

Knowledge as a Tool for Change

Through **90 publications, guides and manuals,** we have provided essential resources for education, research, historical writing and feminist activism. Our publications cover a wide range of topics – from women's rights and political participation to gender-based violence, economic justice, art and engaged feminism. These materials not only document the feminist struggle in Bosnia and Herzegovina and the wider region but also serve as tools to empower new generations of activists, young leaders, and all those committed to building a more just society.



Since 2006, the PitchWise Festival of Women's Art and Activism has become a **hallmark** of the CURE Foundation – **a unique feminist international event** that fuses activism and engaged art. Over the past 19 years, the festival has hosted more than **10,000 participants, including 1,500 artists** from Bosnia and Herzegovina, the region, and across the globe. From avant-garde to engaged feminist art, numerous **world-renowned** names have become part of our shared feminist cultural legacy.

We launched the festival with a clear mission:

TO OCCUPY AND TRANSFORM ABANDONED PUBLIC SPACES INTO SPACES FOR ENCOUNTER AND CREATION,

TO PROVIDE A SAFE AND OPEN SPACE FOR A NEW GENERATION OF WOMEN ARTISTS AND ACTIVISTS,

TO BUILD A HISTORY OF RESISTANCE AND CHANGE THROUGH SOLIDARITY AND CONNECTION WITH SISTERS AROUND THE WORLD.



WOMEN'S NETWORK OF BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA

The CURE Foundation initiated the establishment of the **Women's Network** of Bosnia and Herzegovina, which was officially founded and began its work on 12th September 2009 at a conference of the same name, held as part of the fourth PitchWise Festival of Women's Art and Activism in Bosnia and Herzegovina. The Women's Network of BiH is an informal group that today brings together more than 55 civil society organisations, as well as individuals who advocate for and work on women's rights and the advancement of gender equality. The Network promotes anti-discrimination, freedom of choice, equality, non-violence, and anti-militarism, embracing feminist values such as peace, solidarity, trust, community, equality, and diversity.

The Women's Network of BiH has directed its focus toward strengthening advocacy capacities by technically improving its communication and social platforms. Our website, www.zenskamreza.ba, continues to share the **latest information related to the quality of life of women and girls in Bosnia and Herzegovina, serving as a valuable resource for anyone seeking further information.**





MEDIA VISIBILITY The CURE Foundation has been working for years to strengthen its media presence and remains open to **communication through a variety of chan-nels.** We are active on **Instagram and Facebook**, where we regularly inform the public about our activities and campaigns.
